The government has sought applications for a total of 15 positions of judicial and technical members at the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) as well as the appellate tribunal NCLAT.

As many as 15 posts, including that of 5 judicial and 5 technical members

members, are to be filled up at the NCLT. Besides, applications have been invited for 3 judicial members and 2 technical members at the National company Tribunal (NCLAT).

The last date for submission of the applications online for NCLAT is July 5 and for NCLT is July 19, according to two separate notices issued by the

corporate affairs ministry on Tuesday.

Among other requirements for the positions at NCLT and NCLAT, the applicants should be at least 50 years old.

A person should have been a judge of a high court or a judicial member of the NCLT for five years or has a minimum 10 years of experience to (Turn on pg2)

Territory Administration to improve the situation and take steps to retain the students. "The Project Approval Board (PAB), of Ministry of Education has raised the dropout trend in Class VIII and have requested the J&K administration to analyze the school-wise data and collect information on students pursuing ITIs and polytechnic courses, ensuring that this data is incorporated into the database", said an official source.

India will not tolerate cross-border terrorist activities and it cannot keep aside terrorism to improve ties with Islamabad under its neighbourhood first policy, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on

He said if Pakistan wants to take the relations forward, it knows what to do, adding India has de-legitimised the cross-border terrorism.

The external affairs minister also described the revocation of Article 370 of the Constitution from Jammu and Kashmir in 2019 as a longawaited step, saying it was very crucial for national security.

"I do think that what was done in 2019 was a very very crucial step in a long-awaited step for national



security. The whole world used it against us. They saw it as a point of vulnerability," Jaishankar said at a press conference.

"They saw it as something they should keep pressing and keep using and keep turning as a way of keeping India off-balanced. If we do
